Example Course Outline

Course outlines must consist of a sequential enumeration of the main ideas and supporting details. Indicate the amount of time that will be spent on each main idea.

Supporting details would include any pre-class reading and homework assignments, training aids, and instructional methods that are used other than lectures.

The following is an example of the detail that is required.

VI. Demonstrate How to Powder and Lift Prints A. Slide-tape and actual classroom demonstration	90 min.

VII. Students Practice Locating and Lifting Latent Prints A. Each student will work independently. B. Performance will be evaluated by one of three evaluators	120 min.
